The County of Orange is conducting its AB 52 consultation process for a proposed composting operation at the Olinda Alpha Landfill that will be called the Valencia Greenery. Orange County Waste & Recycling provides this notice pursuant to the provisions of Assembly Bill 52 and Section 21080.3.1(d) of the Public Resources Code, requiring formal notification of projects in the geographic area that is traditionally and culturally affiliated with your tribe. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 21080.3.1, California Native American tribes have 30 days from receipt of this notification to request consultation with OC Waste & Recycling regarding possible significant effects that implementation of this project may have on Tribal Cultural Resources. Please consider this letter and preliminary project information as the initiation of the California Environmental Quality Act, specifically Public Resources Code 21080.3.1 and Chapter 532 Statutes of 2014 (i.e., AB 52). Please respond within 30 days, pursuant to PRC 21080.3.1(d) if you would like to consult on this project.

OC Waste & Recycling owns and operates three active solid waste landfills in Orange County and provides post-closure maintenance at twenty closed landfill sites in Orange County. The active Olinda Alpha Landfill is located at 1942 Valencia Avenue, Brea, as shown on **Figure 1**, **Site Location Map**. SB 1383 requires all jurisdictions in California to recycle at least 50 percent of all organic waste materials that are currently going to solid waste landfills by 2020 and at least 75 percent by 2025. In accordance with this new law, OC Waste & Recycling is proposing to implement a maximum 230 ton per day composting operation on an approximately 7.7 acre area at the existing Olinda Alpha Landfill, refer to **Figure 2**, **Proposed Site Layout**. The composting operation is planned to include a phased approach, starting with open windrow composting and ultimately shifting to a Covered Aerated Static Pile composting operation. **The composting operation will be located entirely on previously disturbed former refuse areas (i.e., on trash).
